## **RESOLUTION NO. 2021-135**

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO VACATE A PORTION OF RED TOP ROAD AND SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING THEREON

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code Section 8320, the City of Fairfield may initiate proceedings to vacate excess right-of-way within the City of Fairfield; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to initiate proceedings under California Streets and Highways Code Section 8320 *et seq.* to vacate an approximately 1,169 square foot portion of Red Top Road, located northerly and westerly to the property generally described as 120 Red Top Road, Fairfield, California, which property is located northwesterly of Interstate 80, as such area is set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B" attached hereto and made a part hereof.

# NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD HEREBY RESOLVES:

- Section 1. The City of Fairfield declares its intention to order the vacation of a portion of Red Top Road more particularly described in Exhibit "A" and depicted on Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and elects to proceed with respect to said street vacation under the provisions of the California Streets and Highways Code, Section 8300, et seq.
- Section 2. The council hereby sets a public hearing regarding the proposed vacation of a portion of Red Top Road for July 6, 2021, at the hour of 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber of City Hall, 1000 Webster, Fairfield, California, or in any other manner as specified on the regular meeting agenda. At the hearing, all persons and entities interested in or objecting to the proposed vacation may express their position on the matter. After the close of the public hearing, the council will consider the adoption of a resolution that declares the portion of Red Top Road to be unnecessary for present or prospective public street purposes and orders the vacation. Said resolution may provide that the vacation is subject to conditions or that the reservation of easements is required.
- Section 3. The city clerk is hereby directed to publish notice of the public hearing in the Daily Republic newspaper for at least two successive weeks prior to the hearing, as required by California Streets and Highways Code Section 8322. In addition, the city clerk is hereby directed to post notices of the public hearing at least two (2) weeks before the date set for the hearing, in conformity with and in the manner provided by California Streets and Highways Code Section 8323.
- Section 4. The city clerk shall certify to the adoption of this resolution.
