# **RESOLUTION NO. 2021-14**

# RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD RECOMMENDING THAT THE CITY COUNCIL APPROVE AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 25, ARTICLE IX TO AMEND EXEMPTIONS TO NOISE REGULATIONS

THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD HEREBY RECITES, FINDS, DETERMINES, ORDERS, AND RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. The Planning Commission has found that it is necessary to periodically review and revise Chapter 25 of the Fairfield Municipal Code reflect City practices and policy.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The Planning Commission has held a duly noticed public hearing on May 26, 2021. City staff presented substantial factual information regarding the proposed Noise Ordinance amendments in staff reports and through oral presentations before the commission, and the commission considered all public testimony and information presented during the public hearing regarding this matter.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. Based on the information contained in the staff report and presented by staff on May 26, 2021, the commission has determined, staff has determined that the proposed amendment to the Noise Ordinance is exempt from further review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under CEQA Guidelines Section 15305, which categorically exempts Minor Alterations in Land Use Limitations

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Based upon the factual information contained in the staff report and presented by staff on May 12, 2021, the commission hereby finds that the proposed amendments to the text of the Noise Ordinance are consistent with the General Plan and recommends the City Council adopt the Zoning Ordinance amendments, as attached hereto as Exhibit A.

<u>SECTION 5</u>. The record of proceedings shall be located at the City's Community Development Department and the director of community development shall be the custodian of such documents. PASSED AND ADOPTED this 26<sup>th</sup> day of May 2021.

(OA2021-003) amending Section 25.1405 of Chapter 25, Article X of the Fairfield Municipal Code (also known as Noise Regulations of the City of Fairfield) to amend Exemptions to said Noise Regulations (Planner Brian K. Miller, 707-428-7446, <u>bkmiller@fairfield.ca.gov</u>)

#### BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

To facilitate and encourage community events while protecting public health, safety, and welfare staff is developing a comprehensive amendment to the City's Special Events regulations contained in Chapter 12A of the Fairfield Municipal Code. The proposed amendments will address types of events, the application materials, and the internal City process. Examples of special events that will be regulated under the new process include such mainstay public events as the Tomato Festival but also private events like church gatherings in public parks, private concerts, and political rallies.

While revisions to Chapter 12A are not directly the purview of the Planning Commission, one component of the Special Events amendments is subject to commission review: changes to the City's Noise Ordinance (Chapter 25, Article X of the Municipal Code). To permit events that may involve amplified music or speakers and other activities that generate noise, staff recommends exempting permitted special events as long as they meet the City's time limits (7:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m.) for construction activities, which are a common activity that also generates noise. As a part of the Chapter 12A amendments, each event would be reviewed on a case-by-case basis, with appropriate conditions regarding noise applied to each permit. This change will allow staff to address potential noise impacts proactively up front within the permit itself, rather than rely on blanket standards in Chapter 25 that may not fit the event or its location.
